

### Golf Cart Storage & Licence Fee



In 2021 the Board revisited the cart licence and storage policy with two objectives in mind.

- 1. Ensuring that we received a fair fee for the storage of carts
- 2. Making the fee structure affordable to ensure that all members were given the opportunity to play golf at the Mansfield Golf Club.

With those two main objectives in mind, the fee was held for those members who produced a Doctors Certificate to indicate they could not play golf without the use of the cart, while the fee was increased to a modest \$10 per week for those members who wished to utilize a cart without a medical reason. Our research shows that the \$10 per week fee is very competitive with the fees charged by other Regional Golf Clubs with a member base similar to ours.

### Clubhouse Happenings


With winter all around us we have stepped up our Club promotions to give members and guests the opportunity to leave the house and be entertained at the Golf Club.


We also had three teams contest the Benalla Bowl, but no winning team result only a great result for Pauline Ahola winning the individual 'D Grade' overall.

through the winter.


