Going forward, we will be passing on some of the more important rules of golf for members - here is the first!

Tips and rules of Golf -

Rule 5.7a - When you may or must stop play.

During a round, you must NOT stop play except in these cases;

- The Committee suspends play.
- You believe there is danger from lightning. in which case you must report to the Committee.
- In match play, you and your opponent may agree to stop play for any reason, except if doing so delays the competition.

If you stop play for any other reason not allowed under this rule or fail to report to the Committee when required, you are **disqualified**.
