TUFF AS TURF TALK - TONY COOKSEY

The late summer has kicked in with February recording 8mm and March 26mm. The countryside has dried out. On the 19th March, I came to work and the irrigation system had gone out on "no flow", so I rang Goulburn Valley Water to let them know and they informed me they are getting low on water! I said that my pumps went out

last night and they replied "Oh, well then you are out of water"! This isn't the end of the world, as the cooler mornings mean we can start backing thewater right off. We still have access to fresh water, but we can only water greens and tees with this. So, you will notice things drying up a bit and you definitely will be getting extra bounce and run. This time of year is a juggling act, as coming into winter we really need to dry the course out as our heavy soils hold the water and can turn the place very boggy in spots.

Now that the cutting has slowed down, we will be turning our attention to smaller jobs around the Club. We recently pruned over hanging bushes and gave the car park a good clean, painted the entrance lines, and cleaned up around the rubbish bins out the back. We are going to put a real focus on the appearance of the Clubhouse surrounds, the Clubhouse itself and the golf course.





Aeration of tees will commence and heavy top-dressing and over seeding will happen. Extra sand will be applied where there are uneven places on the tees. The fairways will be aerated as well and the ugly hydrocotyle weed will be spot sprayed as we go. Cart paths will be tidied up as every


